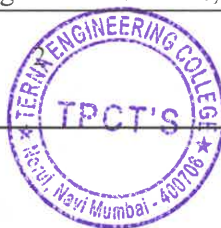

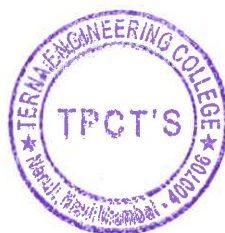

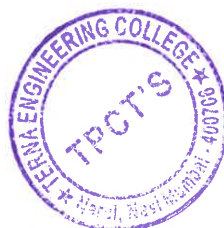


**Yoga Day Webinar, 21<sup>st</sup> June 2023**

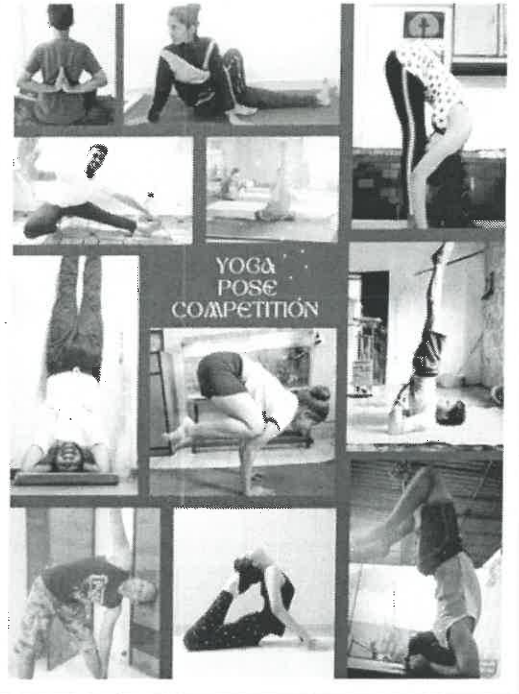

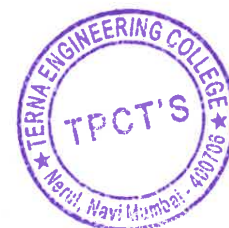

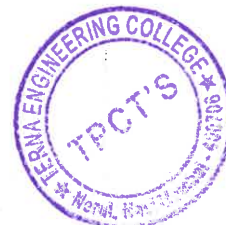

**Objectives of Beach Cleanup were as follows: -.**

- The survey findings highlight several key issues related to waste management in the community.
- The survey highlighted the need for education and community involvement to improve waste management in Worli slums, while also exposing the volunteers to the on-field reality of that community.

### **Summary: -**

The NSS Unit of Terna Engineering College conducted a 'Waste Segregation Survey' in 'Worli Slums' to understand waste disposal practices, with a focus on segregating dry and wet waste. NSS volunteers engaged with residents through a questionnaire, capturing photos of residents with cloth bags, and noted their waste disposal problems. The data collected from this drive is shared in form of excel data sheet with Beach Warriors organization which will be submitted to BMC for improvement in the waste management infrastructure.

The survey findings highlighted several key issues related to waste management in the community. Many residents lack awareness of waste segregation, highlighting the need for educational efforts. Improper waste disposal practices were also prevalent, posing threats to hygiene and overall sanitation in the area. Additionally, residents faced issues such as a month-long absence of BMC waste collection. Limited resources for sustainable waste management were identified as a challenge for some residents, suggesting the necessity of addressing these constraints. The survey revealed that the community is generally willing to engage in waste management initiatives, signaling an opportunity for positive change through community involvement and awareness-raising efforts.

### **Outcome: -**

Volunteers had a positive experience, as residents were cooperative and open to change. The survey highlighted the need for education and community involvement to improve waste management in Worli slums. The volunteers covered "90 Houses". It is a step toward a cleaner environment and healthier community. Also got to know the segregation levels after the waste is thrown away. To dispose the waste accumulated is as much as important as segregating it.

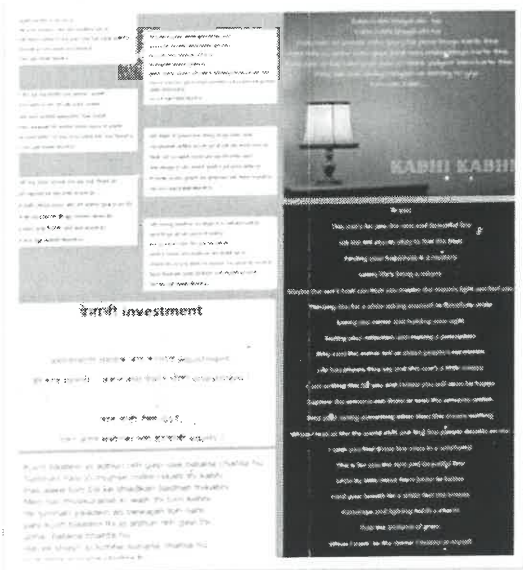

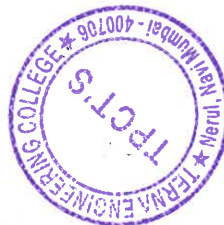

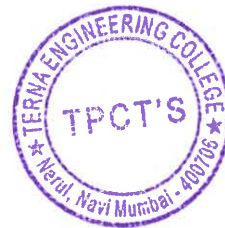

**Outcome: -**

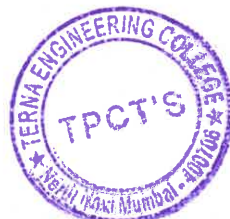

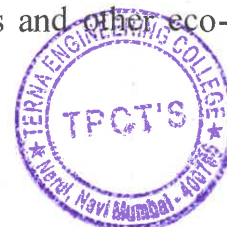

The survey focused on three key areas: the provision of separate dustbins by the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC), household practices for segregating waste, and the use of cloth bags for daily activities.

The survey results revealed that there is a mixed response regarding the BMC’s provision of separate dustbins. Some households reported that BMC provides distinct dustbins for wet and dry waste, while others indicated that waste segregation occurs later in the process. Regarding home practices, a significant portion of households actively segregate wet and dry waste, indicating a growing awareness and adherence to waste management practices. However, there remains a portion of households that do not separate their waste, highlighting a need for further education and encouragement.

Additionally, the survey found that while some households use cloth bags for their daily activities, a considerable number still rely on plastic bags. This suggests a need for increased promotion of cloth bags and other eco-friendly

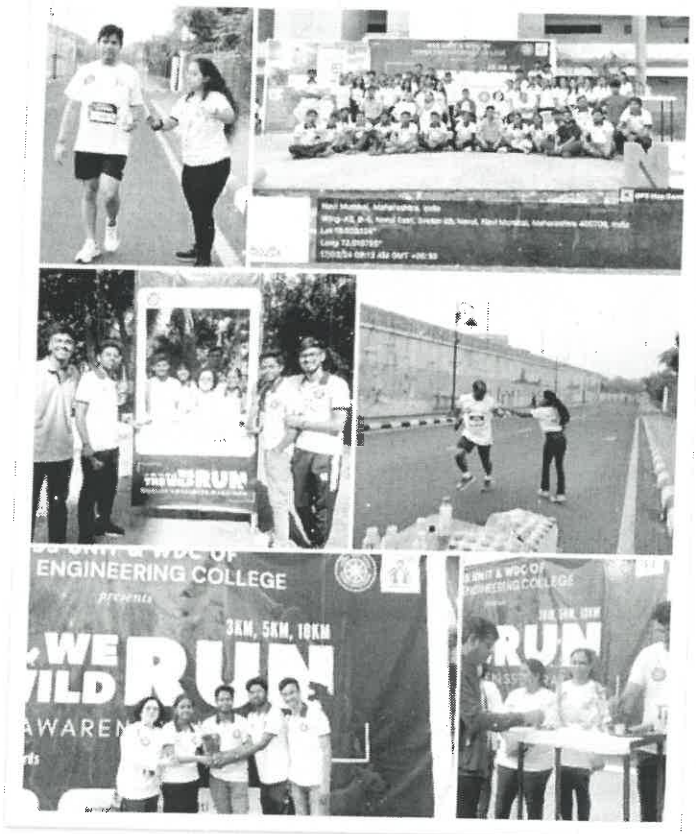
**Objectives:** -

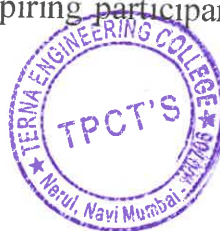
