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Sexually Transmitted Disease Awareness Session

Objectives:

- Educate participants and onlookers about AIDS & HIV.
- Promote prevention measures and the importance of education.
- De-stigmatize AIDS/HIV and dispel associated myths.

Summary:

The NSS Unit of Terna Engineering College organized "Sexually Transmitted Disease Awareness Session". organized in collaboration the Red Ribbon Club. The event aimed to educate students and faculty about HIV/AIDS, its prevention, and management, and to foster a supportive environment for those affected by the virus.

The session began with representing the **Red Ribbon Club**, introduced the purpose of the event and outlined the session's objectives. The primary goals were to enhance understanding of HIV/AIDS, discuss prevention methods, and address stigma and discrimination associated with the disease. The session included a detailed explanation of Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) and Acquired Immunodeficiency Syndrome (AIDS). The speaker highlighted how HIV attacks the immune system and progresses to AIDS if untreated. Participants learned about the primary modes of HIV transmission, including unprotected sexual contact, sharing needles, and from mother to child during childbirth or breastfeeding. The session covered various prevention methods, such as the use of condoms, safe needle practices, regular testing, and the availability of Pre-exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP) and Post-exposure Prophylaxis (PEP).

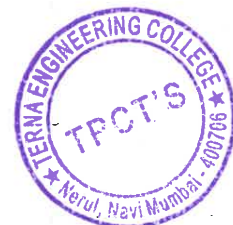
Outcome:

Educational materials, including brochures and flyers, were distributed to all participants. Local resources, including health services and counselling canters, were shared with participants. 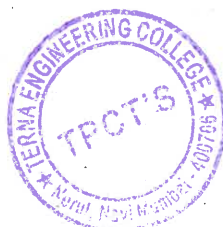


**Vikasit Bharat Sankalp Yatra Function

Summary: -

The NSS Unit of Terna Engineering College participated in a comprehensive Polio Drops Administration Training Program organized in collaboration with the Urban Public Health Centre and the Navi Mumbai Municipal Corporation (NMMC). The program was designed to prepare volunteers for active participation in the upcoming polio immunization drive by equipping them with the necessary skills and knowledge.

The training session was conducted under the guidance of Dr. Vandana Narayani, the Medical Officer at NMMC. Dr. Narayani provided an in-depth overview of the polio vaccine, emphasizing its critical role in eradicating polio and protecting children from this debilitating disease. She explained the procedures involved in administering the vaccine, ensuring that volunteers understood the importance of accuracy and care during the process.

Volunteers were shown the correct techniques for handling vaccine vials, including checking the expiry date and ensuring the appropriate dosage per child. Dr. Narayani also emphasized the importance of maintaining hygiene and following safety protocols to prevent contamination or errors. In addition to theoretical knowledge, practical demonstrations were conducted, allowing volunteers to practice the procedures under supervision. This hands-on experience was crucial in building confidence among the volunteers.

The program not only enhanced the volunteers' understanding of the vaccination process but also instilled a sense of responsibility towards public health and the well-being of children in the community.

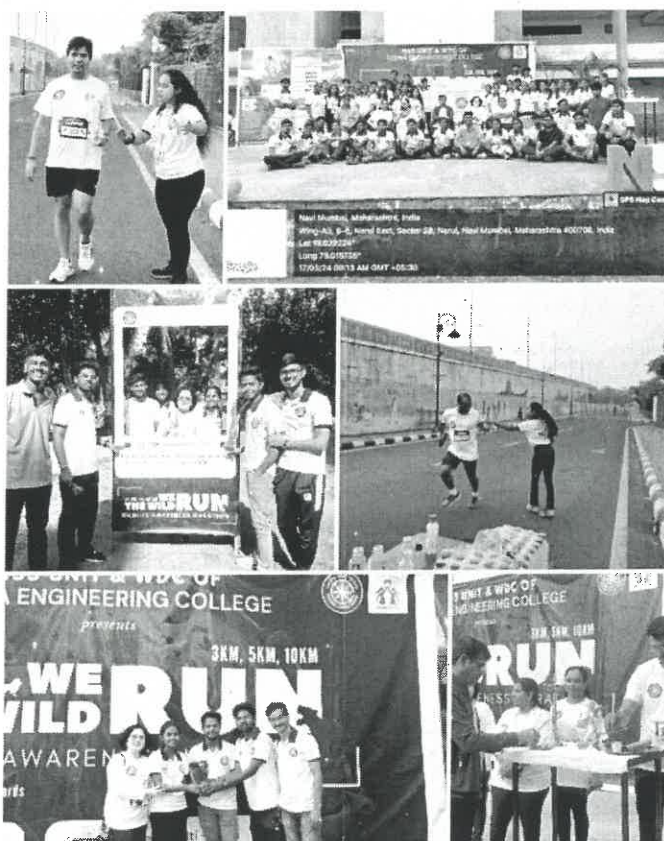
- Encourage physical fitness and healthy living.
